- 1994: Creation of the Soil Information Focal Point at JRC (Ispra)
- 1996: Creation of the European Soil Bureau at JRC

 - multifunctionality of soil contents (water, air)
 - multifunctionality of soil status (dryland, wetland)
 - multifunctionality of soil use
- not enough presentations on soil multifunctionality
